



# JAWS 2014

## Experience the thrill of multiple Watersports.

The Kent County Scout Water Activities Team have arranged a "Have a Go" at water activities day with a choice of either the 5th or 6th July 2014. The day will cater for Scouts and Explorer Scouts who have never been on the water before, or those who would like to try a new activity.

### WHERE IS IT?

Whitstable - Reception, and changing facilities, will be at the Scout Hut (Map Ref: TR110670).

### WHAT HAPPENS THERE?

There are 3 sessions during the day when you can choose from a variety of activities. Provisionally these include: Powerboating; Kayaking; Sailing (in a variety of craft including single handed Toppers, 2-5 people dinghies); Windsurfing; Snorkelling; & Sub-Aqua.

(Sub Aqua is subject to satisfactory health – An additional health questionnaire, supplied with the joining instructions, will need to be completed and brought with you).

The emphasis will be on fun & enjoyment but everyone will be well supervised & safety cover is provided at all times. If weather conditions prevent activities taking place on the water for safety reasons, an alternative land based programme will be provided. **No refunds can be provided.**

### WHAT ARE THE TIMES?

Booking sessions starts at 09.30 on the day. On the water from 11.00 to 17.00. Collection time 17.30

**WHO CAN TAKE PART?** - Kent Scouts & Explorers. Leaders can assist with the organisation on the day, which may involve going on the water.

**HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?** - Just £24.00 for the day.

### WHAT SHOULD I BRING?

- Sweat shirts/jumper
- Long sleeved shirts
- Hat
- Sunscreen
- Soft shoes (eg. trainers)
- Trousers or track suit (no jeans)
- Goggles & Overtrousers
- Swimsuit & Towel
- **Wetsuit (if owned)**
- Change of clothing/footwear

Bare feet will not be allowed, so please bring soft shoes which will get wet. If you wear glasses bring a cord/string to secure them. All water activity equipment will be provided for you.

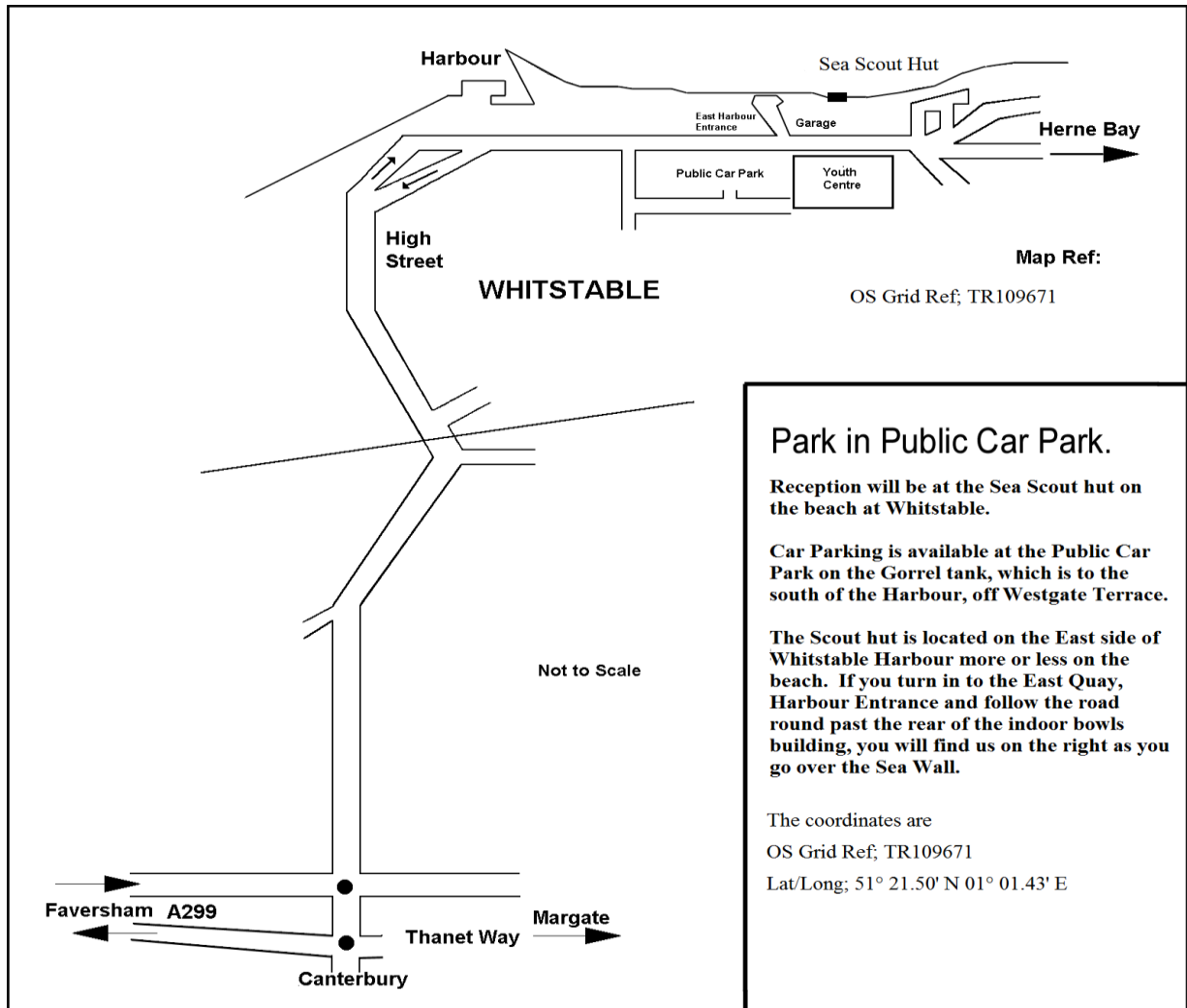

Note: The medical profession takes the view that the parents consent to medical treatment cannot be delegated. This is explicit in the Child Act 1989. Thus medical consent forms have no legal status and a doctor/nurse insisting on the consent of a parent to particular treatment has the right to do so. For this reason we do not recommend that Leaders insist on parents signing the statement above. However, it can be comfort to the medical staff to have general consent in advance from parents or have a Leader on hand able to sign forms required by medical authorities.
